

Risk : Physical intervention used as a last resort

Risk Identified	Level of Risk	Control Measures	Person Responsible	Review Date
Hurting an adult or child/children, Damage to premises or resources	Med/high	<p>If an incident occurs and it cannot be defused using methods in our Behaviour policy, staff may have to physically intervene. This means that a member of staff may physically remove a child from an incident to prevent injuries to themselves or others, damage to premises or equipment and to prevent the incident from escalating.</p> <p>The child will be removed to safe area, held in a way that prevents injury to themselves and the adult until they calm down, then, if appropriate, the adult will talk to the child to find out the cause of the incident.</p>	All Staff	
Recording and speaking to parent/carer	Low	If physical intervention is used, the incident will be recorded in the incident book and the child's parent/carer will be informed at pick up time.	Member of staff	
Injuries - to adult/children	Med	If injuries occur to a child or adult, they will be given first aid treatment if needed recorded in the Accident book	Member of staff	
Damage to premises/ resources	low/med	Damaged resources will be removed by a staff member and any damage to the premises will be blocked/covered safely until it can be mended	Member of staff
